Deadline - May 25, 2012

Highland Street Foundation is now accepting proposals for its Community Impact Consultants (CIC) program, which offers six-month consulting engagements to selected nonprofit organizations. Proposals are currently being reviewed for the July 1st through December 31st period. The selection process will take place in June.

In order to be eligible, nonprofits must be based in Massachusetts, be a 501(c)3, and have an operating budget between \$500,000
